POSITION DESCRIPTION:
The Giant Springs intern will conduct educational tours/programs for school groups and visitors to the State Park. Assist visitors in the Ranger Station by collecting fees, answering questions and informing visitors about the history and geology of the springs and surrounding area. The intern will also assist with light maintenance around the State Park and adjacent conservation lands. Roving interpretation will also be required by the intern, this will be done by walking, biking and driving.

The intern will be required to complete 1 special event throughout their internship. The type of program will be related to conservation, education, interpretation or physical activity (guided hike, designing an interpretive self-guided tour, a weed pulling event, or trail maintenance day)
