

# INDIRECT COSTS

## NON-RESIDENT

It is important to understand your cost of attendance. Your cost of attendance is made up of two different types of costs; direct and indirect. Direct costs are items that will appear on your bill such as tuition, fees, and room and board. Indirect costs do not appear on your bill but are *estimated* costs associated with your attendance. Miscellaneous costs can include items such as transportation, course fees, personal items, etc.

While these costs do not appear on your bill, it is important to consider them. Indirect costs are an estimate so students may not pay the full amount. For example, not all students purchase every text book as they might rent or borrow books to help reduce their cost of attendance. The indirect costs below are provided to help you estimate what a total cost of attendance would look like if you paid for everything out of pocket.

<sup>1</sup>All students are required to have health insurance. Students who do not provide the school with valid health insurance information will be billed for the student plan. Student health insurance is not counted in financial aid COA.
