Montana Western to Hold 126th Annual Commencement Ceremony

Montana Western will celebrate its <u>126th Annual Commencement Ceremony</u> on Saturday, May 6, 2023, at 10:00 a.m. in the Straugh Gymnasium on the UMW campus.

"We look forward to celebrating this important milestone for our students, and we are proud of all of their accomplishments," said Montana Western Chancellor, Michael Reid.

350 Montana Western graduates will be awarded over 400 degrees by the end of the 2022-23 academic year. Of the 350 students, 53 have completed two or more degrees, and 70% of the graduates are receiving honors by achieving a GPA of 3.33 or higher. 160 graduates have chosen to participate in this year's ceremony. The ceremony's Chief Marshal will be Laura Straus, Ph.D., Professor of Education.

Commencement Speaker: Taylor Nahrgang

This year's commencement program will feature speaker <u>Taylor Nahrgang</u>, a 2010 Montana Western graduate and Director of Western & Work Partnerships at Ariat International.

In his current role at Ariat International, Nahrgang is responsible for developing and nurturing key partnerships with stakeholders in the Western and work industries. In his personal life, he loves to rope and is a proud dad.

Nahrgang has a strong connection to the University of Montana Western, where he has served as the Rodeo Club President, ASUMW President, Montana Associated Students (MAS) Vice President, Big Sky Region Student Director, and NIRA Student President. He is also a Big Sky Region Steer Wrestling Champion and a NIRA Steer Wrestling World Champion. Nahrgang currently serves as a member of the University of Montana Western Foundation Board.

Distinguished Alumni Service Award Recipient: Phil Willett

Phil Willett graduated from Montana Western in 2003 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Social Science and a minor in history. He went on to receive a Graduate Degree of Banking from University of Washington Pacific Coast Banking School.

Willett has been involved with Montana Western in various capacities for over 20 years. He has been on the UMW Foundation Board of Directors since 2016, serves as the Board Chairman, and is a member of the Capital Campaign Committee. Currently, Willett serves as the President/CEO of the Pioneer Federal Savings and Loan Association and serves on the Board of Directors for the Montana Independent Bankers Association.

UMW Places First at Road to the Horse & Idaho Horse Expo Colt Starting Competition

A team of students from the University of Montana Western's Natural Horsemanship program placed first in the <u>Idaho Horse Expo Collegiate Colt Starting Competition</u> held April 7-9, 2023, at the Ford Idaho Horse Park in Napa, Idaho.

Road to the Horse partnered with the Idaho Horse Expo to present this year's competition, where three teams competed for a share of the \$6,000 cash prize. Competing teams were from the University of Montana Western, Feather River Community College, and Treasure Valley Community College.

The teams worked with their colts in three hour-long round pen sessions. The finals consisted of a 40-minute timeframe that included 20 minutes in the saddling pen and 20 minutes to complete a list of rail work and obstacle components. Montana Western placed first with a total score of 1183.5, followed by Feather River with 1117.5, and Treasure Valley with 936.5.

2023 Colt Sale Raises Over \$180,000 for Natural Horsemanship Program

The Natural Horsemanship Program, which educates students to work with horses as part of a broad range of equine and academic studies, is a joint program of the University of Montana Western and the Montana Center for Horsemanship.

Every year, as part of the Colt Sale course, UMW students work with young horses to be trained and sold at live auction the following spring. This year's sale generated more than \$180,000 for the program for scholarships, facility updates, and other program needs.

Molly Jackson placed first in the Colt Challenge event on March 31, riding RSR Tarida from the Roaring Springs Ranch. The sale, held the following day on April 1, averaged \$10,069 per colt. The highest selling colt was MR Fritz Badger, ridden by Gus Hoffman and donated by Hollenbeck Ranch.

MDT Highway Resurfacing Project

Week of May 1:

- Continue work on one lane of bridge (over the railroad) and begin bridge wall repair.
 - Traffic: single-lane bridge closures with temporary traffic lights.
- Concrete work: begin to move from East Helena Avenue down South Atlantic Street with some sidewalk removal at intersection corners.
 - Traffic: Atlantic Street is expected to have similar traffic control measures as East Helena Avenue.
 - Pedestrians: partial sidewalk closures day and night while concrete cures.
- Street driveway tie-ins along East Helena Avenue.
