ANSC 100 Introducton to Animal Science This course is an introductory animal science course which includes basic principles of animal genetics, nutrition, live animal evaluation, reproduction, and application to the production of beef and dairy cattle, sheep, swine, horses, and poultry. CTE Ag, Food & Natural Resources Pathway

ARTZ 101 Art Fundamentals

This course is designed for non-art majors. Students will demonstrate the successful application of visual media to the creative and problem solving processes of identifying and communicating visual messages and personal expression and will examine art as an expression of culture and historical context and will do writing exercises in aesthetics and art criticism. GE Humanities/Fine Arts

ARTZ 105 Visual Language: Drawing This studio course introduces rendering

skills through the use of a variety of drawing media, and the expressive, conceptual, and communication possibilities of drawing as an artistic medium. This course also examines art as an expression of culture and historical context and includes writing exercises in aesthetics and art criticism. GE Humanities/Fine Arts

ARTZ 231 Ceramics I

This studio course introduces basic ceramic hand building, throwing, and glazing techniques, and the expressive, conceptual, and communication possibilities of ceramics as an artistic medium. This course also examines art as an expression of culture and historical context and includes writing exercises in aesthetics and art criticism. GE Humanities/Fine Arts

ASTR 110 Introduction to Astronomy An introductory course in the nature and structure of the universe including our solar system, stellar structure and evolution, galactic structure, and the large scale structure of the universe. Day and night observations will be used along with lab projects to familiarize students with the scientific methods used by astronomers. Pre-req: Algrebra I or higher. **GE Natural Sciences**

CAPP 131 Basic Microsoft Office In this hands on course, students will develop a working knowledge of word processing, spreadsheets, presentations, and database management software applications in relation to business. Students will understand and apply basic computer terminology, computer hardware, social and professional issues and other related topics. The course will be evaluated by hands on assignments and examinations. **CTE Business Management Pathway CTE Finance Pathway CTE Marketing Pathway**

CHMY 121 Introduction to General Chemistry

This class is designed for non-science majors. Students will study the fundamental principles of chemistry in the context of real-world applications to atmospheric and water chemistry. Major fundamental topics covered include atomic structure, chemical bonding, chemical reactions, radiant energy, thermodynamics, acids and bases, and solutions. Most applications are cross-disciplinary with physics, biology, and/ or earth sciences. Lab included. Pre-req: equivalent of M 095, Algebra II, high school chemistry recommended. **GE Natural Sciences**

EDEC 247 Child & Adolescent Growth & Development

Students will examine, analyze, and apply research, theories, and issues concerning basic biosocial, cognitive, and psychosocial developmental stages from conception through childhood and adolescence. For integrated lab students use a variety of instruments to observe and interact with individual children as a way of integrating theory and practice. EDEC 248 fourty-five hour lab is integrated. **CTE Education Pathway CTE Human Services Pathway GE Social Science/History**

EDU 201 Introduction to Education w Field Experience

The first formal course in the Teacher Education Program, this course provides an introduction to the field of education and the relationships between schools and society. Students begin to evaluate the reasons chosen to become a teacher and

the effects that decision will have on their lives. Students examine social, cultural, political, legal, economic, and historical issues within schools and how these issues impact professional educators. Students will complete a field experience in a school setting. **CTE Education Pathway CTE Human Services Pathway**

GDSN 230 Video Editing

In this project-based introductory course, students will gain the competencies to create video and audio projects. Skills developed in this course will be design of video and audio projects, capturing and editing video and audio, podcasts, communication through a digital media, and project management. Students will be evaluated on hands-on projects and examinations. CTE Information Technology Pathway

M 121 College Algebra

This course explores a wide variety of functions, including polynomial, rational, exponential, and logarithmic functions. Students will be able to manipulate complicated expressions, understand the relationship between algebra and graphs, and apply their skills to a variety of applications. Pre-req: Math Proficiency Standard.

GE Mathematics

MART 214 Digital Publishing & Design In this project-based course, students will gain competencies in communication skills in print and graphic design. Through handson activities, students will learn how to create interactive documents meant for digital publication. Students will be evaluated on hands-on projects and examinations. WRIT 101 College Writing I

Writing 101 serves as an overview of collegelevel writing—a course that provides students the opportunity to analyze the strengths and weaknesses of their writing process as it has developed during their K-12 education and to adapt that writing process to progressively more difficult writing tasks. AHMS 107 Career Essentials for Health Professions

Students will learn to work successfully in healthcare facilities and in their desired allied health care career. Topics include communication strategies, professional behaviors and attitudes, legal and ethical practices, and safe practices in healthcare. CTE Health Professions Pathway

ARTH 160 Global Visual Culture

Explore visual arts, music, drama/theatre, and dance with some attention to literature and applied arts. Students learn art fundamentals and discuss such questions as: what are the arts; how are the arts created,what do arts communicate, and how do the arts reflect society? GE Humanities/Fine Arts

EDEC 130 Health, Safety, & Nutrition in Early Childhood

Students will examine health and safety issues in early childhood settings including protection of children from injury and illness, promotion of their health development, nutrition and recognition and reporting of abuse and neglect. CTE Education Pathway CTE Human Services Pathway EDEC 210 Meeting the Needs of Families Students will explore the complex characteristics of families and communities through language, cultural values, ethnicity, socioeconomic conditions, family structure, relationships, childhood trauma, and community resources. Students will also practice techniques that encourage parentteacher partnerships. CTE Education Pathway CTE Human Services Pathway

EDEC 247 Child & Adolescent Growth & Development

Students will research theories, and analyze issues concerning basic bio-social, cognitive, and psychosocial developmental stages. Students will use a variety of instruments to observe and interact with children as a way of integrating theory and practice. CTE Education Pathway CTE Human Services Pathway GE Social Science/History

EDEC 249 Infant/Toddler Development & Group Care

Students will research theories, issues, developmental stages, and the application of these in relationship to the child from birth to 3 years. Students are required to complete a 45-hour lab component in a licensed/registered facility serving infants/ toddlers. CTE Education Pathway

CTE Human Services Pathway

EDU 201 Introduction to Education w Field Experience

This course provides an introduction to the field of education and the relationships between schools and society. Students examine social, cultural, political, legal, economic, and historical issues within schools and how these issues impact professional educators. CTE Education Pathway CTE Human Services Pathway

EDU 222 Educational Psychology

Candidates will explore, compare/contrast and analyze major psychological theories of development and apply them to teaching practices. They will study major progression of physical, social, emotional, and cognitive development in children. They will learn teaching approaches to accommodate diversity of all learners with regard to learning styles, varying intelligences, gender differences and cultural expectations. CTE Education Pathway CTE Human Services Pathway HSTA 102 American History II A survey of the important events and key issues involved in the emergence of the United States as a world power after the Civil War, and how that power has been exercised through the present day. Includes attention to the assimilation of foreign born immigrants, the roots of Civil Rights activism with respect to African-Americans, and efforts to deal with the "Indian problem." GE Social Science/History

M 105 Contemporary Math

This course is designed to give students the skills required to understand and interpret quantitative information that they encounter in the news and in their studies, and to make numerically based decisions in their lives. Topics may include working with units and measurement, set theory, financial mathematics, and some concepts of statistics and probability. Pre-req: Math Proficiency Standard. GE Mathematics

PHOT 154 Exploring Digital Photography An introduction to the basic operation of DSLR cameras and editing and printing digital photographs. The class will also explore the expressive and conceptual possibilities of digital photography as an artistic medium, with additional focus on photography's influence on history and culture.
